SOLUTION TO PLASTIC POLLUTION









A green craft contest in commemoration of the World Environment Day 2023 was organized by Angel Support Foundation in partnership with Environment and Climate Change Amelioration Initiative (ECCAI) and Initiative for Socialeconomic and Ecological Advancement (ISEA) at Unique Secondary School Makurdi on the 5th June, 2023. 'Solutions to Plastic Pollution' was the theme for this year's World Environment Day.

The aim of the contest was to see how plastics could be recyled so as to end indiscriminate dumping of plastics in the environment. Five (5) secondary schools were in attendance and came up with brilliant innovative crafts with plastics and were awarded.

The Deputy Director of the Federal Ministry of Environment Omotunde Adeola emphasized that 'if we don't take responsibility as individuals, we will not see the change we desire' and also the need to bridge the awareness gap, she also made assurances that the government will do more in ensuring the sustainability of the environment.

INTRA-STATE DIALOGUE FORUM ON PROTECTING OUR COMMUNITY NETWORK (POCN)







An Intra-state dialogue forum on protecting our community network (POCN) was organized by NEEM Foundation and took place at Trust Resort conference hall on 17th July, 2023. The forum was aimed at creating an avenue for community members and stakeholders to share firsthand the positive impact of the project



with regards to the dialogue component and the methodology of the project. CLIMATE ADAPTATION FOR CLIMATE ADOPTION STRATEGIES, INITIATIVES AND PRACTICES

The Centre for Climate Change and Development, Alex Ekwueme Federal University, Ndufu-Alike (CCCD – AE-FUNAI), Ebonyi and the **Africa Policy Research Institute** (APRI), Germany, with the support and collaboration of the Department of Climate Change (DCC), Federal Ministry of Environment, Nigeria organised a zoom workshop on **Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) in Nigeria: Strategies, Initiatives, and Practices.**

This meeting convened to present the key findings of the research on Climate Change Adaptation Policies, Strategies and Local Actions in Nigeria, West Africa. It highlights Locally Led Adaptation (LLA) strategies, practices and lessons that can inform and guide the implementation of the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) and climate actions at the local and national levels. STRENGTHENING WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS FOR SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENT PROJECT II (SWAMSEP II).

ngel Support Foundation (ASF) with funding from ACT Foundation commenced the implementation of the project 'Strengthening Waste Management Systems for Sustainable Environment Project II (SWAMSEP II)' in May 2023 and will round up in April 2024. SWAMSEP II is a 12 months project aimed at building up waste management systems to ensure that responsible waste d i s p o s a l p r a c t i c e s a r e i m b i b e d i n c o m m u n i t i e s a n d s c h o o l s SWAMSEP II through high-level advocacy in addition to the advocacies in phase one will visit critical Government offices within the state who will be instrumental to the allocation of a dumpsite and strengthen the waste management architecture of the state, review existing policies to enforce payment of levies by polluters for re-engagement of private waste managers; a composite of which will ensure effective waste management, raise awareness to foster proper waste management practices in communities.

The project will also monitor the Environment, Health and Hygiene clubs which were established in phase I of the project in schools to ensure there is a constant transfer of knowledge on best waste management practices and re-use of plastic as exhibited in the beat plastic challenge with students.

To portray a practical example of the re-use of plastic, the project will construct an Eco-brick toilet in a community to be replicated by other community members. Massive awareness on proper waste management practices, legal frameworks and other hygienic practices will be created through Rally, Radio Talk show, Jingles to the general public.

The project has an overarching goal to reach out and strengthen solid waste management systems and improve environmental sanitation for 10,000 beneficiaries (women girls, men, boys) in 6 council wards in Makurdi local government area of Benue state in line with sustainable development goal 6 (water and sanitation) by 2024. The activities to be implemented on the project are; Advocacies, Clean up exercises, construction of Eco

MONTHLY SANITATION







ASF on her SWAMSEP II has continued to sensitize members on the proper waste management and disposal methods and to carry out monthly cleanups in communities with community members also partaking in the activity.

Three (3) communities Northank I, Modern Market, and Clerk Ward out of six (6) communities have been cleaned and the community members sensitized on the second phase of the project so far.

This monthly sanitation is aimed at sensitizing and creating awareness to community members on the dangers associated with indiscriminately dumping refuse unpropriately.



ADVOCACY





Angel Support Foundation paid advocacy visits to the heads of the following offices; Benue Planning Commission, Benue State Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (BERWASSA), National Environmental Standards And Regulations Enforcement Agency (NESREA), Benue State Environmental Sanitation Agency (BENSESA),

The advocacy visits were aimed at advocating for the allocation of an approved dumpsite, re-engagement of private waste managers and the support of the ministries in strengthening the system for a cleaner environment within the state capital.

Radio Talkshow





A radio talk show at harvest FM was aired in line with one of SWAMSEP II goal; SENSITIZATION, and two guest speakers Mr Simon Hambe and Mr Onah Temple who are environmentalists were present to discuss how they manage waste respectively as individuals. During the talk, Mr Onah Temple made it known that the business of waste management should not be rested on the shoulders of the government alone, stating that all individuals had a role to play in it.

SENSITIZATION RALLY



ASF on her SWAMSEP II organised a sensitization rally to sensitize the market people at Wadata Market in Sarkin Ruwa community in Clerk council ward.

WIDOWS SELF RELIANCE PROGRAM







Angel Support Foundation in line with one of her thematic areas 'Women and Youth Empowerment'z funded by Dr. & Mrs Emmanuel Sokpo trained the 2nd batch of widows at Abaji-Kpav, in Katsina-Ala LGA. 40 widows on the 2nd batch were given soft loans with 0% interest rate to engage them into small medium enterprises also alleviating them from poverty, making them become self-reliant and independent.

POWERING PEACE THROUGH CLIMATE ACTION PROJECT (PPCA)

Powering Peace through Climate Action program is the project implemented by Angel Support Foundation and funded by International Alert Nigeria across two communities (Egba and Ologba) in Agatu Local Government Area, Benue state. Powering Peace through Climate Action Project seeks to pioneer approaches to build peace through inclusive and intersectional climate action in Benue State. Climate Change has adversely impacted communities and livelihoods, this can be seen as a result of the many interventions launched to aid mitigation and adaptation. In Agatu, farmers are experiencing drought, little or no rain etc which has resulted into poor farm yields making the crop available very expensive and unaffordable for the community members. Continuous cropping has also resulted into land dessertification.

This current situation has devolved into crises as community members are scrambling for the little resources available.

DEVELOPMENT OF PEACE AND LOCAL ADAPTATION PLAN.







Angel Support Foundation the implementing partner alongside a team of consultants visited and held a meeting with the two communities on the 15th August, 2023. The lead, team of consultants in person of Mr. Unongu Thomas addressed the two communities and told them that peace must be installed between the two communities in order to pave way for development through climate action. He enjoined them to free their minds to cooperate and discuss freely and come up with the main root of the issues affecting them, thereafter, proffer solutions to allow peace take charge.

A need assessment was conducted and participants came up with needs which could support their livelihood. READ MORE
