2.1 Brief history of the organization

Angel Support Foundation (ASF) is a non-governmental organization with special consultative status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (UN ECOSOC) and observer status to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), non-religious, non-partisan and non-racial organization that derives its existence from the need to create a society and people with a purposeful driven attitude towards environmental sustenance, with particular focus on women, Children and the youth, creating an adequately sensitized and mobilized populace to embrace positive environmental and hygienic behaviors that would ultimately support livelihood.

The organization also derives the essence of her existence from the burning need for gender equality in communities and the need for peaceful co-existence among inhabitants. This, the organization does by initiating self-reliant projects and advocacies aimed at creating awareness on vital environmental activities, promoting gender equality, while building peaceful co-existence among inhabitants and communities in Benue state in particular and Nigeria in general.

Established in 2012, Angel Support Foundation was registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) in 2013 with registration Number; CAC/IT/65283, with a mandate to create awareness in the areas of environment and all matters connected therewith (paying particular attention to Women, Children and Youth), promote gender equality and implement activities in the area of peace building. The organization has its head office in Makurdi – Benue State, a branch office in Lafia- Nassarawa State and is administered by a Board.

4.0 Major Achievements

- “Connecting Women and Youth” Project: Spanning six LGAs in Benue State, it empowered over 54,221 individuals, including students and community members, through skills acquisition, awareness campaigns, and waste management training.
- Community-Led Climate Action Project (CLCAP): Implemented across 11 council wards in Makurdi LGA, it reached over 10,898 beneficiaries with climate change mitigation training, tree planting, and clean-up exercises, fostering environmental sustainability.
- Repositioning Communities for Sustainable Peace and Security: Across mining communities in four LGAs, 60 environ-defenders were trained to monitor environmental impacts and strengthen community development agreements.
- Strengthening Women in Benue Communities to Combat Reckless Mining: Benefiting over 3,500 individuals directly and 10,000 via media, the project raised awareness about responsible mining practices and promoted community resilience.
- Powering Peace Through Climate Action Project: In Agatu LGA, it engaged 10,558 individuals in peacebuilding and climate resilience initiatives, facilitated peace charters, and constructed boreholes, a fish pond, and a briquette house.
- Promoting Micro Enterprises (PROMIC): Empowered 800 women through financial literacy and provided microloans to 159 participants, fostering entrepreneurship and reducing poverty.
- Widows Self-Reliance Program: Supported 82 widows in Katsina-Ala LGA with mentorship, microfinance loans, and skills training, enabling financial independence and resilience.
- Enhancing Communities Resilience Against Harmful Practices (EnCReP): Benefited 1,500 community members in mining-affected areas with eco-friendly farming training and alternative livelihoods to mitigate environmental impacts.

- Young Community Voices for Climate Justice Advocacy – Cohort II: Engaged 24 youth in climate justice advocacy, building their capacity to champion environmental sustainability in their communities.
